SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

Remove affected person from the danger area and lay down.

After inhalation

Provide fresh air. In case of accident or unwellness, seek medical advice immediately (show directions for use or safety data sheet if possible). In case of inhalation of decomposition products, affected person should be moved into fresh air and kept still. Remove casualty to fresh air and keep warm and at rest.

After contact with skin


